

Syllabus for Departmental Examination of the Indian Forest Service Officers & Manipur Forest Service Grade-II Officers.

- Note I:** Paper-I to Paper IV will be of Objective Type. Paper V and VI will be of conventional type.
- Note II:** The question papers carrying 100 marks will consist of 100 multiple choice questions (Objective Type) with a duration of 2 (two) hours. Similarly, the question paper(s) carrying 50 marks will consist of 50 multiple choice questions (Objective Type) with a duration of 1 (one) hour.
- Note III:** Paper V & VI will carry 50 marks (**30 for Written Exam and 20 for Viva-voce**) with duration of 1 ½ hours for written exam.
- Note IV:** **Pass Mark - 60**
